<p>Plan a holiday that you would like to have, including how you would get there, price, accommodation and why you would want to go to that place.</p>	<p>Compare the average temperature of three places - 1 in England, 1 in Europe and 1 in Africa - throughout the year - plot them on a line graph for each month.</p>	<p>Design a new type/flavour of ice-cream. Sketch your design and explain your idea.</p>	<p>Create a PowerPoint presentation on one holiday destinations from each of the following continents; Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, South America.</p>	<p>Create your own 'holiday song.' Write lyrics and see if you can record yourself singing it.</p>
<p>Choose a mode of transport, draw it and label all the forces that are acting on your mode of transport which makes it move.</p>	<p>In Summer, many people want to get a "beach body". Design and perform a 6 exercise circuit at home. (E.g. sit ups, star jumps, squat thrusts).</p>	<p>Continue this piece of creative writing: "As the plane landed, the passengers' eyes widened as they saw the beauty of the tropical island."</p>	<p>"The 6-week Summer holidays for school students are too long! Include some 'memorable' lines.</p>	<p>Pick your holiday dream destination and create a poster to advertise it.</p>	<p>Complete research on Seaut's painting 'A Sunday afternoon'.</p>
<p>Some people cannot afford to go on holiday abroad. Write a list of ten ways that people can enjoy a 'staycation' in the UK- think about the different activities provided in the community.</p>	<p>Find 5 places in the world that are popular holiday destinations and describe why they are popular.</p>	<p>Work out the timings (what time to leave home, get transport, arrive at airport, arrive at destination and accommodation, time to return and arrive at home) and costs of a 2-week holiday somewhere in America including accommodation, transport, meals, excursions, and spending money.</p>	<p>"We don't have to physically go on holiday, we can travel to different places in our minds." Use a mobile device (phone, tablet, camera) to take photos of a holiday.

You have been asked to design a leaflet for either a beach holiday or a skiing holiday advertising its best features-add images and key facts.

Work out the cost of a 2-week holiday in Europe including accommodation, transport, meals, excursions, and spending money.

Design a picnic to take on a day out in the summer holidays.

Professional sports team often do tours of other countries.

What is the **Lions Tour** and what sport is it for?

What is the **Ashes Tour** and what sport is it for?

What is the **PGA Tour** and what sport is it for?

Some holiday resorts are associated with music, festivals and clubs. Create a fact sheet about a music resort that has music associated with it. Who has played there? What genre of music do they play?

People usually take electronic devices when they go abroad on holiday but will need to charge them when they get there. Create an informative poster highlighting the different socket types from some countries from around the world.

"Holidays bring tourists and tourists boost the economy of a place." Explain, in your own words, what this means. You could give an example.

Create a copy of one of David Hockney's paintings of a swimming pool. Add colour to your work.

Describe what makes a place a popular holiday destination.

Describe how planes communicate to each other and to air traffic control.

Prepare and make a traditional dish from another country.

Draw and label 10 seaside resorts on a map of the UK.

Think of a holiday you have been on (if you have not been on holiday, it can be a day trip or visit to somewhere fun)- write a short diary entry all about it.

Create an observational drawing of a shell. Include tone and mark marking to represent textures.

Holidays give people a chance to relax. Write a list of activities you could take part in on holiday that would help to improve mental wellbeing and relaxation.

See if you can find 5 songs that contain the word 'Holiday'. List the following: Name of song, composer/band, genre, instruments used, tempo. Do you like them? Why?

You are going on holiday to Tokyo - research and present how they use digital technology for entertainment and at restaurants.

Imagine a suitcase packed for a holiday in the sun - what 3D shapes might you find in it (and the suitcase itself) - name them and say what properties they have e.g. number of faces, edges and vertices and the shapes of the faces.

Pick a destination in the world that you might like to go on holiday to in future - What is there countries favourite sport? Does this country have any odd or weird sports that you didn't know about?
